Speakers

Jayne Ayers will present material developed specifically for this Symposium. She will discuss how straightness and loss of straightness affect suppleness of the back of the horse; elements of the correct bending and maintaining lateral balance; the role of the front legs in longitudinal balance and engagement, and the role of balance in a supple and carrying



back. On Sunday, she will teach eight riders, focusing on improved rider alignment, balance and symmetry, as well as exercises to develop the horse's back.

Jayne is a Federation Equeste Intereationale "I" and USEF "S" Dressage judge as well as an "R" sport horse breed judge. A member of the USEF Dressage Committee, she is a former executive board member of the USDF and founder of the USDF sport horse committee as well as a member of the USDF L Program Faculty, teacher and coach.. She enjoys teaching students of all ages and abilities. She has coached Para-Olympic riders who successfully competed at the 2010 World Equestrian Games.

Carmi Weininger will present saddle fit for the rider, and an in-depth analysis of the relationship between equine anatomy and the dynamics of saddle fit; how to resolve saddle fitting problems; rider variations in anatomy including leg length, pelvic floor, hip articulation and circumference. Saddle variations include seat size, width, stirrup bar placement, and twist. The Saturday presentation will include labs for clinic riders to learn about their own tendencies and saddle fit needs...



On Sunday, Carmi will lecture and demonstrate how to evaluate saddle fit for the horse in the morning. Topics include:

- Helpful Saddle Fitting Tools
- Testing Saddle Fit on Standing Horse
- Testing Saddle Fit on Moving Horse
- Signs of Good Saddle Fit
- Signs of Poor Saddle Fit

In the afternoon, she will evaluate saddle fit for the horse.

Carmi is known across the U.S. as an educator and innovative thinker who is committed to improving the comfort and performance of horses through saddle fitting. Her saddle fitting clinics and seminars help educate equestrians regardless of riding style. She has been featured as an expert in Chronicle of the Horse and Trail Blazer magazines and serves as a regular guest lecturer in Functional Anatomy at the University of Guelph in Ontario, Canada.
